REQUIREMENTS FOR THE GENERAL ANTHROPOLOGY MAJOR.

Foundation Courses to apply for the Major

To transfer in to the Anthropology major, students must complete **ANT** 110 and <u>one</u> of the following options:

Option 1: Statistics (STA 115, B- minimum)

Option 2: Statistical Inference (STA 215, C minimum)Option 3: Introduction to Logic (PHL 120, B- minimum)

Core Courses (3 units)

Students must earn the grade minimum in prerequisite courses (as noted below) before they may register for these required core courses.

Introduction to Cultural Anthropology – ANT 110

A survey of the major concepts of social-cultural anthropology. Cross-cultural comparison will be a central concern of the course, as will the process of cultural change.

[Grade minimum: B-]

Development of Socio-cultural Theory – SOC 301 (Must be taken at TCNJ during Fall or Spring semester)

Prerequisite: ANT 110

The response of social theorists to the consequences of the industrial revolution and the issues of capitalism, secularism, industrialism, modern consciousness, and the socio-critical enterprise, as seen through the work of such theorists as Marx, Durkheim, and Weber. Contemporary development of these theories will also be discussed.

Senior Capstone in Anthropology

(Must be taken at TCNJ during Fall or Spring semester)
